

Called to order at 5:10 p.m

Minutes: Approved as corrected.

Treasurer's Report: Accepted.

Membership Report:

- National will increase dues \$2 in the coming year and another \$2 in the following year; an increase in State dues is pending. New member applications should reflect the dues increases.
- Sylvia Borovay reported the branch now has 99 members.

<u>Programs Report</u>: Myra Radlow outlined program topics for the March, April and May meetings.

<u>AAUW Fund:</u> Connie Smith distributed flyers for the AAUW Fund fundraiser — a charcuterie board demonstration Saturday, April 19 from 10:00 a.m.-noon at The Annex at Tustin Legacy. Cost is a \$100 donation to AAUW Fund and a \$45 cash fee at the door to cover supplies. RSVP deadline is April 9.

Tech Trek:

- Mary Witten reported the Chick-fil-A fundraiser netted \$200.11. The mail campaign generated \$3,500. The branch now has enough funds to send four girls to Tech Trek next summer at Whittier College June 15-21.
- Tracey Clark moved and Beckie Gomez seconded a motion to underwrite Lauran Lansdon's TSAO dues for the coming year in appreciation for her generous donation to Tech Trek. Passed.

<u>Public Policy:</u> Beckie distributed Public Policy handouts and reminded members that Lobby Days training is scheduled for March 31.

Interbranch Council: Mary circulated a signup sheet to staff the AAUW table at the Great American Write-In on March 29. Beckie advised to participants carpool and register in advance online.

Communications: Newsletter and Website:

- Tracey is in the process of updating the website calendar.
- Lenore confirmed the newsletter deadline for submissions is March 12.

<u>Nominating Committee</u>: Mary reported that the slate of branch board nominees is complete except for the post of President-Elect.

President's Report:

- Beckie ordered a retractable tabletop sign that will be ready next week.
- Fifty local organizations will participate in the Great American Write-In.
- Beckie proposed TSAO participate in the Sunset Markets held 5:30-8:00 p.m. on the third Thursdays, May through September, in Old Town Tustin at a cost of \$25 per month, for the purpose of raising community awareness of AAUW.
- Mary moved and Sylvia seconded the purchase of a popup canopy bearing the AAUW logo at a cost not to exceed \$500. Passed.
- Sylvia moved and Tracey seconded a payment not to exceed \$125 to reserve spots for a TSAO booth at the Sunset Markets. Passed.
- Beckie announced a gift card drive to assist AAUW members who lost homes in the January fires. Details online.
- The Named Gift Committee met and submitted names of honorees.

<u>New Business:</u> Myra suggested renaming the "Wine and Whine" interest group so as not to play into female stereotyping. "Happy Hour" was proposed but no decision was reached.

Mary Witten reported on the upcoming Tech Trek interviews and thanked members who donated to Tech Trek.

President Beckie Gomez reported:

- The branch newsletter deadline is March 12.
- Public policy handouts are available to members.
- The Great American Write-In is March 29, and she explained the purpose of the program and encouraged members to register and attend.
- The Board voted to participate in the Sunset Markets, May through September in Old Town Tustin, to educate the community about AAUW and recruit new members.
- State AAUW is collecting donations of gift cards for AAUW member fire victims.
- National dues will increase \$2 for 2025-26 and will increase another \$2 for 2026-27.
